Regulations For Toggenburg All-American

1. To qualify for nomination each animal must meet each of these requirements:
 - a. Registered Purebred or American Toggenburg.
 - b. At the time of nomination each animal must bear a legible tattoo.
 - c. Each animal must have competed in at least one official ADGA show during 2011 and have been awarded at least one of the following:
 - I. First in individual class.
 - II. Grand or Reserve Grand (Jr. Show or Sr. Show).
 - III. Senior or Reserve Senior, Junior, or Reserve Junior Champion (Combined Show).
 - IV. Second in individual class in an official ADGA show with more than 15 female or male Toggs exhibited.
 - V. A permanent Champion placing first or second in a Champion Challenge Class.
2. Person nominating the animal must be a member in good standing of the National Toggenburg Club and the present owner at the time the nomination is made. Nominee may be entered in only one age class for this year's All-American. Note: Animals should be nominated in the age class they competed in during 2011.
3. Photographs - Include ONLY tattoo information on back of picture. Photos need to be sharp and clear – either black and white or color. Digital photos need to be printed on glossy photo paper. Each entry must include 3 copies of each picture submitted.
 - a. One side view (required). The following two pictures are optional, but highly recommended: one rear view of udder and legs (or escutcheon area if nominee is a dry doe), and one view from above, showing the top line and wither from rear.
 - b. All photos must be taken during the year for which application is made.
 - c. Try not to include any ribbons, trophies, farm names, signs, show information or people in the photo. **JUST THE ANIMAL.**
 - d. **Please do not send any photos larger than 4" x 6" or smaller than 3"x5", this is the size requirement.**
 - e. No retouched photos (the entry will be disqualified).
 - f. All photographs will be retained by the NTC for display in a photo album for display at National Shows and Conventions.
4. Show information is the primary information that will be used to evaluate entries. You may include linear appraisal scores, and official milk records. The judges will take all information provided into account when making their All-American selections.
5. It is the owner's responsibility to verify the accuracy of all information provided on the entry form. Any entries found to be fraudulent will disqualify the animal from competition in the program for life.
6. All entries must be postmarked by December 19, 2011 (Received by December 31.) No late entries accepted. Packets must be sent out to the judge in early January. Selections will be made in sufficient time to permit results and photographs to be published in the March issue of United Caprine News & an issue of Dairy Goat Journal.
